Introduction

The recent enlargement to new Member States and the project of the new Treaty establishing “A Constitution for Europe” are challenging steps forward in the development of the European Union.

Such developments, together with the achievement of a single market, require a new approach to human resources development. Today, all those aiming at top positions, both in industry and in services, need to be well versed in EU legal proceedings, in the regulations and procedures of single market, as well as in means to access EU resources.

The University Institute of European Studies (the only recognised European Documentation Centre in Piedmont) and the Centre for Studies on Federalism, supported by Compagnia di San Paolo, has launched a training programme (third edition) on European economic law and competition: “Law and Business in Europe”.

This Course, organised under the auspices of the University of Torino, the University of Fribourg (Switzerland), the Carlo Cattaneo University (LIUC), the European Training Foundation and the European Policy Centre, aims at providing young graduates with specific and practical competencies on EU regulations and markets, including competition and regional policies.

Contents and methodology

The programme is designed as an intensive workshop, combining theoretical and practical approaches. Intensive training based on problem-solving approach is what makes the Course unique. The programme comprises roughly 50 training days (including lectures, case studies, performance-oriented exercises and interaction with resource persons, tutors and fellow participants).

The programme has been designed to provide specific competencies in the field of European economic law, business and competition, such as:

- **European Governance** (European institutions and policies, economic freedoms, external policies, global trade and WTO relationships).
- **Competition** (antitrust control, multilateral relations on competition, state aids and other subsidies, public procurement, competition in services and public utilities, intellectual properties).
- **Enterprises** (policies and initiatives in support of enterprises, European company law, European policy for SMEs, consumer contracts, tax law).
- **European Financial Support** (structural funds and financial instruments in practice, European programmes and regional policy management and monitoring, how to apply for a EU project, regional policy and enlargement).

Participants will also be exposed to the following subject areas:

- EU sites and data bases.
- EU recruitment procedures: the multiple choice formats to assess candidates competencies.

Assessment of participants’ performance will occur during the Course through case studies, practical exercises and tests.

Requirements and language

Graduates in Law, Business, Economics, Political Science or with equivalent qualifications and undergraduates in the final year of attendance (provided they are on schedule with their exams) may be admitted.

The Course is taught in English. A good working knowledge of the English language is essential.

Application and attendance

The following supporting documents must be enclosed with the application:

1. Copy of the official degree certificate and official lists of academic results.
2. A complete curriculum vitae (including postal and e-mail addresses).
3. Where the applicant’s mother tongue is not English a certification of proficiency in English, preferably in the form of an officially recognised test (such as TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge certificates, etc.).

The documentation (which will not be returned) should be sent to the L.B.E. Course Secretariat.

Full-time attendance is required throughout the programme.

Deadline and selection

Complete applications and documentation should reach by mail the L.B.E Course Secretariat not later than **18 June 2007**.

To meet the deadline, a complete copy of the application might be sent by e-mail or fax. Please note that a signed copy of the application must be sent in any case by post.

Selection will take place on the basis of the documentation received. The Course Secretariat will notify each candidate of the results of the selection not later than 31 July 2007.

Tuition fees

Tuition for the programme is set at EUR 1.100,00 (one thousand and one hundred).

Tuition fees cover: registration, tutoring, teaching equipment, stationery, documentation and training material.
